Dear Mr. President,

Following the recent announcement of your gun control legislative package, we the undersigned Members of Congress are concerned that the proposals you outlined do not fully consider the voices of millions of law-abiding Americans who support the Second Amendment.

On December 14, 2012, the entire country was shaken by the tragic shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School. We extend our deepest sympathies to the victims' families and the entire Sandy Hook community. Understandably, this crime has sparked a national dialogue about whether there are steps that could have prevented this tragedy, but this dialogue must proceed in a manner that is consistent with our nation's rights and values. We believe that at its core, the problem is not the absence of law, but rather a lack of respect for human life and human dignity.

It is also our expectation, and your constitutional obligation, that you will work with Members of Congress in pursuing all of the Administration's proposals through the legislative process, rather than unilateral action by the Executive Branch. The American people deserve and the U.S. Constitution requires a transparent and open discussion on issues of such national importance. This constitutional process provides a voice for all Americans. The desire for prompt action should never cause us to overlook our founding document, our most sacred beliefs, the Constitution. Like you, we have sworn our allegiance to the Constitution, with the full understanding that nobody—not even the President of the United States—is above its principles.

Your proposals do not adequately recognize that simply having access to a firearm does not cause murderous intent or criminal nature. Countless more children who are raised in homes with lawful firearms do not commit crimes than those who do. That is why it is most important that we gain an in-depth understanding of the malice, and probable mental illness, from which these criminals suffer. A gun does not turn an otherwise law-abiding citizen into a murderer, but that gun may protect a law-abiding citizen from one.

Significantly absent from your proposals were the voices of the many Americans who protect themselves and their families, who prevent crime, and who participate in sport lawfully under the Second Amendment. Since December 14, gun purchases by law-abiding Americans have increased – not decreased. Since December 14, membership in organizations supporting the Second Amendment, such as the National Rifle Association, has increased – not decreased.

While your proposals assume the answer is more laws and fewer guns, millions of other Americans want an increased ability to protect themselves and their families. As we remember the victims of Sandy Hook, let us not overlook the many citizen heroes who have prevented or thwarted similar tragedies with their right to bear arms. Whether it is the convenience store clerk from Battle Creek, Michigan who protected himself and his customers from a robbery because he was armed with a gun, or a single mom guarding her baby during a home invasion—guns are used every day to make this country safer. In fact, guns are used every day in this country to protect the most vulnerable among us.

Again, we are all here under an oath to our Constitution to serve the American people. That a proposal would not pass both houses of Congress is not a justification to circumvent Congress, but all the more reason why we must respect the constitutional process of law-making. As Supreme Court Justice Thomas Clark cautioned, “Nothing can destroy a government more quickly than its failure to observe its own laws, or worse, its disregard of the charter of its own existence.”

Dear Mr. President,

As Members of Congress we have, like you, sworn to defend the Constitution of the United States. The seriousness of this public oath compels us to pursue the noble cause of defending individual liberty. With each decision we make, we must consider the effect that it will have on the country that our children and grandchildren inherit.

Following the recent events in Newtown, Connecticut, public debate has shifted attention toward federal gun control. Our hearts go out to the victims of the tragedy in Newtown, as well as their families. Many of us are fathers and mothers ourselves, and the thought of losing children under such horrific circumstances is unimaginable. However, we do not believe that stricter gun legislation is the answer to protecting our future generation.

The Supreme Court has ruled that the Second Amendment means what it says. We will not support, and in fact we will strongly oppose, any legislation or executive order that prevents law-abiding Americans from responsibly exercising their Second Amendment rights, including any attempt to prevent ownership of certain firearms or ammunition. As public officials we have a duty to ensure that criminals are punished for their acts of violence. But we will not sit idly by while law-abiding citizens are stripped of their constitutional rights and turned into criminals by an overreaching federal government.
